

## MLA Citation Format

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of work." Article's original source and publication date:  
[Indent 5 spaces]page numbers. Product name. Publisher. Date researcher visited site.  
[Indent 5 spaces]<Electronic Address, or URL, of the source>.
