Students will be able to create a map about a topic of their choice from the list of topics given to them in library class. An illustrated map combines the features of a map with pictures and graphics to illustrate some of the more important events. You may use pictures, graphs, etc to explain the significance or development of events on your map.

| Title | Title tells the purpose/content of the map, is clearly distinguishable as the title (eg. larger letters, underlined, etc.), and is printed at the top of the map. |
| Labels-Accuracy | Items are labeled and located correctly. |
| Labels & Features-Neatness | Labels/features can be read easily. |
| Map-Legend/key | Legend is easy-to-find and contains a complete set of symbols, including a compass rose. |
| Scale | All features on map are drawn to scale and the scale used is clearly indicated on the map. |
| Spelling/Capitalization | Words on the map are spelled and capitalized correctly. |
| Color Choices | Student always uses color appropriate for features(e.g. blue for water; black for labels, etc.) on map. |
| Graphics & Pictures | All graphics & pictures are attractive (size and colors), well executed and support the theme/content of the presentation. |
| Documentation | You have properly documented 2 or more good sources for your topic. Source sheet and notes are attached to project |
| Objective or Thesis | Clearly stated and appropriately focused. |
